Hatid Malasakit to Postal Employees:

Booster Shots and Regular Antigen Testings

Last January 17 and February 10, more than 1,000 postal workers and letter carriers and their qualified dependents were administered booster shots of anti-Covid 19 vaccination doses through the rollout of the "Resbakuna Program" of the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) and the City of Manila's Health Department. This made the Post Office the first Government-Owned and Controlled Corporation (GOCC) to receive a total dose of vaccination for its employees.

Meanwhile, Antigen testings are also being regularly conducted at the Manila Central Post Office as part of the institution's health and safety protocols.

CSC Prioritizes filling up of PHLPost plantilla positions

One of the Commission's main functions is to regulate the administration and implementation of plantilla positions on government agencies.

Filling up of vacant positions will be prioritized, on top of the list are the postmen or karteros nationwide. This initiative is a step towards strengthening post offices and distribution centers in key cities across the country.



Trainings and seminars resume amidst the pandemic

WOMEN'S MONTH CELEBRATION

The Philippine Postal Corporation (Post Office) celebrated 2022 National Women's Month in March with a series of events, including a lecture on sexual harassment and the Safe Spaces Act, health services engagement, gender and development, and honoring solo parents and employees.

The stamp design contest with the theme "End Violence Against Women" was also launched for all Post Office employees nationwide, which aims to share their creativity and support in a community without gender-based sexual harassment. The winning design will receive a cash prize amounting to 15,000 pesos and will be featured in the stamps to be issued and launched on November 14, 2022, while the 2nd and 3rd place will receive 10,000 pesos and 5,000 pesos each.

In addition, the Post Office paid tribute to women letter carriers and frontline workers nationwide for their dedication, perseverance, and years in the postal service.

One seasoned woman letter carrier stated, "After decades of working here in the post office, for our sacrifices to be recognized now is a great feeling. This has been our life for so long and we are very grateful".
